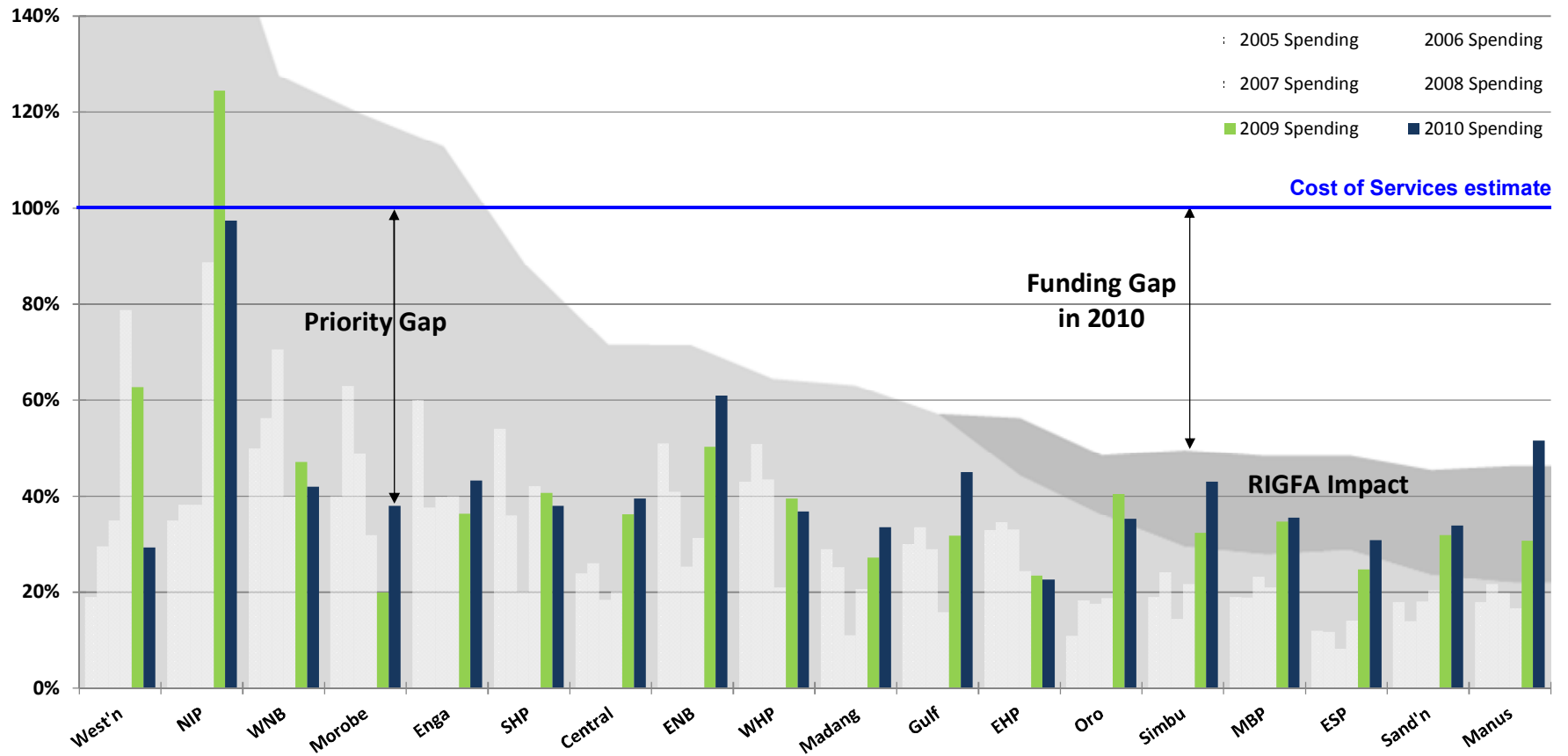

Key Issues – Budget Implementation

- ✓ late releases of warrants/cash
- ✓ issues with rollovers of function grants
- ✓ poor capacity
- ✓ non prioritization of goods and services spending
- ✓ late submissions of provincial budgets
- ✓ poor accountability of districts and LLG expenditures

Evidence of Reforms Working

“ All provinces have received increases in their grants (2008-2012)

- ✓ More money transferred as grants to provinces
 - ✓ Provincial Function Grants increased from K84m (2008) to K261m (2012)
- ✓ Grants as a greater share of the national pie
 - ✓ Proportion of grants to recurrent has increased (2.04% in 2008 to 3.84% in 2012)
- ✓ More money to poorer provinces
- ✓ Increased funding for priority areas

“ Evidence of improved provincial performance

- ✓ Improved budgeting, implementation and reporting
- ✓ Provincial prioritization of minimum priority activities
- ✓ Greater compliance with financial management principles
